



Autumn Term Reception/Year 1 Homework Grid

Food & Farming

Please choose one piece of homework each week to complete. Usually homework is handed in on a Monday, under the new circumstances please upload work that children want to share in the form of a photo or video to your childs HWB... J2easy... files ... 'Food and Farming'.

Reading is important for your child to make adequate progress children need to be heard reading often, as well as our daily reading activities, please ensure your children are listened to at home as often as possible.

English	<p>Help draw or write the shopping list for the week.</p> 	<p>Reception practise reading Phase 2 sounds found in the front of the reading record. Need an additional challenge, learn to read the tricky words: I, no, go, the, into, to</p> <p>Year 1 practise reading Phase 5 sounds found in the reading record book. Learn the Phase 4 tricky words: Said, have, like, so, do, come, some, when, little, were, there, what, when</p> <p>Write these words in a sentence to help learn them off by heart.</p>	<p>Listen to stories containing farm yard animals. Say what you thought about the story.</p>  <p>Can you re tell the story by looking at the pictures?</p>	<p>Reception, practise sounding out and blending words. Adult sounds out a CVC word (c-a-t, d-o-g, d-i-g, b-i-g, d-a-d, a-n-d etc...) Once the children are confident with this you say a word for example, got and the child sounds it out g-o-t. This takes a long time to learn and once children learn this, it will help them become an increasingly confident reader and speller.</p> <p>Year 1 We are learning the story of the little red hen in class, can you adapt the story and write your own? This may take a few sessions to do.</p>

Make an item of craft from wool.</p> <p>Maybe a pom-pom, weaving, knitting, wrapping, friendship bracelet, spiders web etc...</p>	<p>Can you make a miniature farm out of a shoe box?</p> 	<p>Look at the maths activity (cutting fruit into halves and quarters) use the fruit to draw or paint your own artwork.</p> 	<p>Make your own song or rhyme up. Use farm onomatopoeias (noises that things make).</p> <p>Write it down or preform it for the class!</p>
